State Supports Local Community Housing Initiatives

The Ohio Development Services Agency awarded 38 communities grants to rehabilitate, repair, and construct affordable housing for low-income Ohioans as well as provide homeownership and rental assistance. The Community Housing Impact and Preservation Program grants total nearly \$23.6 million. The grants are funded by the Ohio Housing Trust Fund, federal Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME programs.

“We work with local communities to improve our neighborhoods and the quality of life for all Ohioans,” said David Goodman, director of the Ohio Development Services Agency.

The Community Housing Impact and Preservation Program uses a flexible, community-wide approach to improve affordable housing for low- and moderate-income Ohioans and neighborhoods in Ohio communities.

The following cities and counties received grants:

Adams County received a \$400,000 grant to complete six home rehabilitations and repairs at 12 homes.

Ashland County received an \$850,000 grant to partner with the city of Ashland to complete 14 home rehabilitations and repairs at 24 homes.

Ashtabula County received an \$850,000 grant to partner with the city of Ashtabula to complete nine home rehabilitations, repairs at 23 homes and four rental homes, and provide homeownership assistance to three families.

Carroll County received a \$400,000 grant to complete six home rehabilitations and repairs at 11 homes.

Champaign County received an \$800,000 grant to partner with the city of Urbana to complete 10 home rehabilitations, repairs at 20 homes and five rental homes, and to help Habitat for Humanity build two homes.

City of Campbell (Mahoning County) received a \$975,000 grant to partner with Mahoning County and the city of Struthers to complete 15 home rehabilitations, repairs at 37 homes and eight rental homes, build a new home with Habitat for Humanity, and to provide rental assistance for 16 families.

City of Circleville (Pickaway County) received an \$800,000 grant to partner with Pickaway County to complete two home rehabilitations, repairs at 20 homes and two rental homes, and provide rental assistance to 70 families and homeownership assistance to nine families.

City of Delaware (Delaware County) received a \$322,200 grant to partner with Delaware County to complete repairs at two homes, provide rental assistance for 33 families and build two homes with Habitat for Humanity.

City of Eaton (Preble County) received a \$792,600 grant to partner with Preble County to complete six home rehabilitations, repairs at 18 homes and 10 rental homes, and provide homeownership assistance to two families and rental assistance to 27 families.

City of Elyria (Lorain County) received a \$250,000 grant to complete six home rehabilitations.

City of Fremont (Sandusky County) received an \$850,000 grant to partner with Sandusky County to complete 12 home rehabilitations, repairs at 27 homes, build a new home with Habitat for Humanity, and provide rental assistance to six families.

City of Geneva (Ashtabula County) received a \$700,000 grant to partner with the city of Conneaut to complete 10 home and two rental home rehabilitations, and repairs at 19 homes and one rental home.

City of Kent (Portage County) received a \$300,000 grant to complete four home and seven rental rehabilitations.

City of Marietta (Washington County) received a \$300,000 grant to complete nine home rehabilitations.

City of North Ridgeville (Lorain County) received a \$175,000 grant to complete four home rehabilitations and repairs at six homes.

City of Sandusky (Erie County) received a \$250,000 grant to complete four home rehabilitations, provide rental assistance to four families, homeownership assistance to one family, and build a new home with Habitat for Humanity.

City of Sidney (Shelby County) received an \$850,000 grant to partner with Shelby County to complete eight home rehabilitations, repairs at 20 homes, and to provide rental assistance to 55 families.

Coshocton County received an \$800,000 grant to partner with the city of Coshocton to complete 10 home rehabilitations, repairs at 23 homes, build a home with Habitat for Humanity, and to provide homeownership assistance to three families.

Fayette County received a \$712,500 grant to partner with the city of Washington Court House to complete eight home rehabilitations, repairs at 24 homes, build a new home with Habitat for Humanity and provide homeownership assistance to three families.

Gallia County received a \$675,000 grant to partner with Meigs County to complete eight home rehabilitations, repairs at 25 homes, build a home with Habitat for Humanity, and to provide homeownership assistance to six families.

Harrison County received a \$395,600 grant to complete six home rehabilitations and repairs at nine homes and five rental homes.

Highland County received a \$625,000 grant to partner with the city of Hillsboro to complete 12 home rehabilitations and repairs at 24 homes.

Hocking County received a \$1.25 million grant to partner with Perry County and the city of Logan to complete 14 home and two rental home rehabilitations, repairs at 34 homes and five rental homes, and to build two homes with Habitat for Humanity.

Huron County received an \$850,000 grant to partner with the city of Norwalk to complete 12 home rehabilitations, repairs at 28 homes and to provide rental assistance to three families.

Logan County received an \$800,000 grant to partner with the city of Bellefontaine to complete 10 home rehabilitations, repairs at 23 homes, build a home with Habitat for Humanity, and to provide homeownership assistance to two families.

Lucas County received a \$750,000 grant to partner with the city of Oregon to complete 15 home rehabilitations, repairs at 29 homes, and to build a home with Habitat for Humanity.

Madison County received a \$630,000 grant to partner with the city of London to complete seven home and five rental home rehabilitations, repairs at 11 homes, and to provide rental assistance to 10 families.

Medina County received a \$200,000 grant to complete three home rehabilitations and repairs at seven homes.

Mercer County received a \$398,000 grant to complete six home rehabilitations, repairs at six homes, and to provide rental assistance to 20 families.

Miami County received an \$850,000 grant to partner with the city of Piqua to complete nine home and seven rental home rehabilitations, and repairs at 21 homes and eight rental homes.

Monroe County received a \$400,000 grant to complete six home rehabilitations, and repairs at 10 homes and two rental homes.

Noble County received a \$382,200 grant to complete two home rehabilitations, repairs at 12 homes, build a home with Habitat for Humanity, and to provide homeownership assistance to three families.

Pike County received a \$400,000 grant to complete six home rehabilitations and repairs at 12 homes.

Putnam County received a \$900,000 grant to partner with Allen County to complete 10 home rehabilitations, repairs at 26 homes, build three homes with Habitat for Humanity, and to provide rental assistance to five families and homeownership assistance to one family.

Trumbull County received a \$250,000 grant to complete four home rehabilitations and repairs at seven homes.

Union County received an \$850,000 grant to partner with the city of Marysville to complete nine home rehabilitations, repairs at 25 homes, build a home with Habitat for Humanity, and to provide rental assistance to nine families and homeownership assistance to two families.

Van Wert County received an \$800,000 grant to partner with the city of Van Wert to complete 10 home rehabilitations, repairs at 21 homes and to build two homes with Habitat for Humanity.

Wyandot County received an \$800,000 grant to partner with the city of Upper Sandusky to complete 13 home rehabilitations and repairs at 24 homes.
